



## MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI AND UNIVERSITAS TADULAKO

Universitas Tadulako and The University of Mississippi agree to implement this memorandum of understanding effective as of the day representatives of both universities affix their signatures.

This agreement is based on the principle of reciprocity and expresses the interest of both parties in exchanging scholars, students, academic information, and materials in the belief that the research and education processes at both institutions will be enhanced and that mutual understanding between their respective scholars and students will be increased by the establishment of such exchange programs.

- The universities agree to encourage the development of the following exchange programs based on their respective academic and educational needs:
  - Exchange of faculty
  - Exchange of students (undergraduate and/or graduate)
  - Joint supervision of masters and doctoral students
  - Exchange of academic information and materials
  - Organization of joint research programs
  - Organization of joint conferences
  - Organization of other academic exchanges agreeable to both universities
- 2. The parties recognize that the implementation of any specific program will depend upon the academic interests and expertise of individual faculty members and upon the availability of financial resources. Accordingly, the implementation of each exchange program based on this agreement shall be separately negotiated and determined by both universities. In addition, the responsible liaison officers for each specific agreement will be identified for any specific program that is agreed to on the basis of this Memorandum of Understanding.
- 3. This agreement is not intended to be a legally binding document. It is meant to describe the nature of, and to suggest the guidelines for, the possible areas of cooperation described above.

Nothing therefore shall diminish the full autonomy of either institution, nor will any constraints be imposed by either upon the other in carrying out this agreement.

4. The agreement shall be in force for a period of 5 years and may be renewed. It is also understood that the agreement is subject to revision or modification by mutual written agreement and that either institution may terminate the agreement at any time, although such action would be taken only following mutual consultation in order to avoid possible inconvenience to the other institution.
